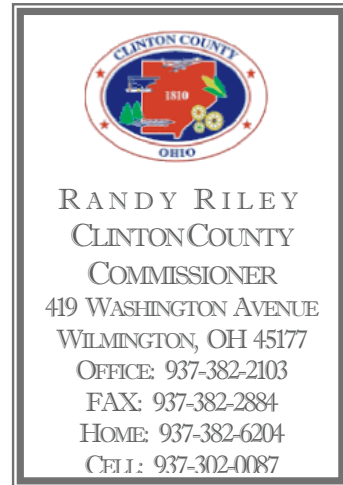

To all of our Friends and Neighbors at ABX,

The announcement by DHL on May 28 has triggered community-wide concern and reaction. The Board of Clinton County Commissioner's fully supports the work of the Economic Task Force under the direction of Lt. Governor Lee Fisher and Mayor David Raizk.

We currently do not know what specific outcomes we can expect. Our ultimate response cannot be based on speculation, but must be based on what DHL actually does. Unless, or until, they sign a contract with UPS we can only prepare for the many possible outcomes that may result from their announcement.

Our top priority is to get DHL to reconsider their ill-conceived deal with UPS. If that doesn't work, we would certainly try to halt or delay their move through whatever legal means are available.

If all else fails and DHL leaves the area, we will take whatever steps necessary to secure community control of the air park. In the latter situation, we would also work to recoup all the economic incentives provided by the state and local government that were used to bring DHL to Clinton County.

Regardless of what happens with DHL, we will continue to seek economic development for our community, jobs for our citizens and security for our future generations.

My concern is not with the billions of dollars that may be lost by DHL. My concern is with the thousands of employees that will be impacted by their short-sighted decision.

The strength of this community does not come from the various corporations that choose to move into our county; our strength comes from the work ethic and the integrity of our citizens.
